

WHEEL HOE ATTACHMENTS

CULTIVATOR TEETH



The Cultivator Teeth work great for soil preparation and general cultivation. Use them to incorporate compost and other soil amendments into the top layer of soil before planting. They also are the ideal attachment to break up the soil crust after heavy precipitation. For preventative weed control, use the Cultivator Teeth in your garden at least once a week and after every rain.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Place 3/8" x 2" Carriage Head Bolt from bottom up through Cultivator Teeth into the toolbar.
- Adjust to desired position and secure with 3/8" flange nut using a 9/16" wrench.
- On the Single and Double Wheel Hoes, the teeth can be installed anywhere along the toolbar. On the High Arch Wheel Hoe, the teeth must sit in the designated notches along the toolbars.

PLOWS



Our Plow attachment allows you to easily create furrows and hills in the vegetable garden. Great for hilling crops like potatoes and corn. Plow blades may be purchased individually or as a set of 2. Plows are compatible with the Single, Double and, High Arch Wheel Hoes.



INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Each Plow blade contains a fixed bolt and a non-fixed bolt. The Plow blade(s) should be installed with the attachment arm under the toolbar (see above photos).
- When installing the Plow blades, the fixed bolt and the non-fixed bolt will be set in opposite directions. The fixed bolt should be facing upwards and the non-fixed bolt should be facing downward so that the square carriage portion of the non-fixed bolt sits snugly inside the groove on the toolbar.
- Tighten each nut with a 9/16" wrench.

HILLING & FURROWING POSITIONS

- To use the Plow Set for hilling, left Plow (L) should sit on the right and the right Plow (R) should sit on the left. Use the hilling position for creating elevated beds or for hilling crops.
- To use the Plow Set for furrowing, the left Plow (L) will sit on the left and the right Plow (R) will sit on the right. Use the furrowing position for creating a furrow or trench for drip tape or planting seeds and transplants.
